

Beware of EBT Theft and Scams!

California has been experiencing an increase in occurrence of Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT) theft. It is important to learn how to recognize these scams to avoid it happening to you.

The California Department of Social Services is providing security tips for those who use EBT cards to receive food (SNAP) and cash aid with a short YouTube video. Click this link to watch, or scan the QR code: www.youtube.com/watch?v=opg52FxKoSo.



The video outlines how public assistance benefits can be stolen from EBT cards using:

- Text message and phone scams
- Card skimming technology
- Fake websites

A few tips to avoid scams:


- Don't click on links in text messages or respond to EBTrelated messages. Your county or the state will never text you or call you requesting your personal information such as EBT card number, PIN, or date of birth.
- "Number spoofing" is when scammers can make their number look like one you trust, so a text message or phone call may appear to come from a legitimate source. If you're unsure, contact us directly.
- Skimmers are put over ATMs and retailer terminals to skim/copy your card information. The video contains pictures and tips for how to spot one.
- To avoid small, secret cameras recording your PIN, always cover your hand when you're entering your PIN.
- Always check the URL of the website you're on. The official California EBT website is <u>www.ebtproject.ca.gov</u>. It's important to note that the real site ends in <u>ca.gov</u>. If you see a URL that ends in something else, it's fake, and you should close the page.
- The same goes for fake email addresses. Scam emails will come from an email address that doesn't match who they claim to be.
- Don't be pressured into making a quick decision. A person from the government or legitimate business won't mind if you take your time in getting back to them. Scammers, on the other hand, will push you so you don't have time to think.

Remember to be aware and be skeptical!

If you think your benefits may have been stolen, you should immediately call the customer service telephone number on the back of your EBT card: 877-328-9677, or contact Mono County Social Services at 760-924-1770.



WORK INNOVATION AND OPPORTUNITY ACT Reimbursement of up to 90% of Wages to Employers

Are you an employer looking for help? The specific technical skills you need may be hard to find. The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) On-the-Job Training Program helps you train the right workers to meet your requirements.

The WIOA wage reimbursement is 90% for employers that have 50 or less employees. Employers that have over 50 employees can receive a wage reimbursement of 50%.
