Make Sure Your Medi-Cal Information Is Up To Date

Medi-Cal covers vital health care services for you and your family, including doctor visits, prescriptions, vaccinations, mental health care, and more. So, if you have Medi-Cal, make sure you renew it when it's time.

Update your contact information

Report any new changes to your name, address, phone number, and email address, so your county can contact you.

Check your mail

Counties will mail you a letter about your Medi-Cal eligibility. You may need to complete a renewal form. If you're sent a renewal form, submit your information by mail, phone, in person, or online, so you don't lose your coverage.

Create or check your online account

You can sign up to receive alerts on your case. Create or log into your account to get these alerts. You may submit renewals or requested information online.

Complete your renewal form (if you get one)

If you received a renewal form, submit your information by mail, phone, in person, or online to help avoid a gap in your coverage.

Fiscal Technical Specialist I

Working under close supervision this is an entry level position. Employees in this class receive in-service training and are given detailed instructions in the performance of routine accounting, statistical and case recordkeeping tasks. Employees are expected to promote to the Fiscal Technical Specialist II level after one year of satisfactory performance.

Fiscal Technical Specialist II

Working under general supervision this is a journey level position. Employees at this level are expected to have background and experience in the area of financial, statistical, or case recordkeeping and reporting.



Example Skills and Duties:

- Maintains financial and statistical records.
- Prepares or assists in preparing statistical and fiscal reports.
- Assists with compilation of budget information including work and time records.
- Codes, verifies, and files various financial documents.
- Handles money transactions.
- Checks, balances, and reconciles cash statements and computerized reports.
- Processes or assists with the processing of documents such as invoices, purchase orders, warrants, and other records.
- Writes letters, memos, or documents to correspond with public and private organizations/agencies to obtain or verify information.
- Answers telephone calls to provide, elicit, or verify information or data.
- Performs other clerical duties such as typing, filing, counter service, copying, etc. on an as needed basis.
- Performs related duties as assigned.

Qualifications: Six months to one year of full-time clerical experience. Or equivalent to 15-30 semester units or 22.5-45 quarter units that included relevant coursework.

CALFRESH

IMPORTANT! CalFresh Emergency Allotments are Ending!

What are CalFresh Emergency Allotments?

CalFresh Emergency Allotments are temporary increases to regular CalFresh benefit amounts. During the COVID-19 pandemic, Congress authorized Emergency Allotments to help meet food needs. This means that since March 2020, households received an increase of at least \$95 in CalFresh benefits per month.

What is the change?

CalFresh Emergency Allotments will end the month of February 2023. A final Emergency Allotment will be issued in March 2023.

Why the change?

CalFresh Emergency Allotments are ending because the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 ends the issuance of CalFresh Emergency Allotments to households in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

What happens next?

You will get less CalFresh beginning April 2023. While the regular CalFresh benefit you are eligible for is not changing, you will no longer get the additional CalFresh benefit you have been getting due to the Emergency Allotments ending. The regular CalFresh benefit you get is the CalFresh amount put onto your EBT card between the 1st and 10th of each month. Your regular benefit amount is based on your circumstances, including your household size, income, and deductions. As this is a required change, there are no hearing rights related to the loss of Emergency Allotment benefits. No further action is required.

¡IMPORTANTE! ¡Terminan los depósitos de emergencia de CalFresh!

¿Que son los depósitos de emergencia de CalFresh?

Los depósitos de emergencia de CalFresh son aumentos temporales a las cantidades regulares de CalFresh. El Congreso autorizó los depósitos de emergencia durante la pandemia de COVID-19 para ayudar a satisfacer las necesidades alimentarias. Desde marzo del 2020, se depositó un aumento de al menos \$95 al mes en beneficios de CalFresh.

¿Cuál es el cambio?

Los depósitos de emergencia de CalFresh terminarán el mes de febrero de 2023. Se emitirá un depósito de emergencia final en marzo de 2023.

¿Por qué va cambiar?

Los depósitos de emergencia de CalFresh están terminando porque la Ley de asignaciones consolidadas de 2023 finaliza la emisión de los depósitos de emergencia de CalFresh a los hogares en respuesta a la pandemia de COVID-19.

¿Qué puedo esperar?

Recibirá menos CalFresh a partir de abril de 2023. Su cantidad regular de CalFresh no cambiará, pero no recibirá el monto adicional debido a la pandemia por que terminan los depósitos de emergencia. El monto depositado en su tarjeta EBT en los primeros diez días del mes es su cantidad regular de CalFresh. La cantidad de su beneficio se basa en el tamaño y las circunstancias de su hogar. Como el cambio es obligatorio, no existen derechos de audiencia relacionados con la pérdida de los beneficios de emergencia. No se requiere ninguna acción adicional.





Reimbursement of up to 90% of Wages to Employers

Are you an employer looking for help? The specific technical skills you need may be hard to find. The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) On-the-Job Training Program helps you train the right workers to meet your requirements.

The WIOA wage reimbursement is 90% for employers that have 50 or less employees. Employers that have over 50 employees can receive a wage reimbursement of 50%.
